Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In recent days our lives have been gripped by grief as we have had to say goodbye to Sisters and Brothers who have graduated to the Kingdom of Heaven. Being separated from ones we love, and those who have played an important part in our lives, brings a heaviness to our hearts. Oh, how precious it is to have a living hope. Paul, writing to the church in Thessalonica says, "We do not want you to be uninformed brothers and sisters, concerning those who are asleep, so that you will not grieve like the rest, who have not hope." Because we walk with Christ, we have a living hope. (1 Thessalonians 4:13)

In the coming weeks will begin a new sermon series from first and second Thessalonians. The title of the series will be Words of Hope. In this unprecedented season where the nightly news reports the number of deaths for the day, we need these words from God's Word to grip our hearts with Hope. Throughout this sermon series I want to encourage you to read through these epistles several times so that we might learn to "Rejoice always, pray constantly, give things in everything; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." Phil has been a pastor and counselor, both here in Michigan and in Texas. Children's Ministry (1st-6th Grade)

Greetings from the Children's Department! We have had a low-key winter, as seems to be the norm now-a-days. In spite of this, we've been able to meet online and in person, and are thankful for the time we have gotten to spend with the amazing kids here at MRBC.

In November we began an online meet-up via Zoom called *Cocoa with the Kogelmanns*, which is our version of "tea time." We connect each Thursday at 4pm to fellowship, play games, to read God's Word and pray together. We will continue each Thursday throughout the winter months, or as needed. We have also posted an online video Bible devotion each week for kids.

On Wednesday, January 20, we began to meet in person. At 6pm, the boys meet for Royal Ambassadors and the girls meet for Girls in Action. Both groups are missions-focused and teach about missionaries, the work that they do and the places in which they serve. They also will have opportunities to work on mission projects. Then, at 7pm, all the children come together for a time of Bible study, worship, fellowship and fun.

For children who attend the in-person worship services on Sunday morning, please notice the kid's table set up in the lobby. There you will find sermon notes, along with coloring and/or activity pages, plus the occasional surprise. Please check each week for new items.

Although it is different from what we've been used to in the past, we are enjoying our time online, and in person, and praying God uses all of this to draw children, their families, and the Children's Department Team closer to Him.



The goal of a follower of Christ is Christlikeness. As followers of Christ, we should be taking steps of faith daily that
